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## **RUN WELCOMES PROF. GREG HILL AS CHAIR AND THANKS PROF. JAN THOMAS**

Professor Greg Hill, Vice-Chancellor of the University of the Sunshine Coast, will be the next chair of the Regional Universities Network (RUN).

He will take over from Professor Jan Thomas, Vice-Chancellor of the University of Southern Queensland, on 17 November 2016.

RUN's Executive Director, Dr Caroline Perkins, welcomed Professor Hill to the role and thanked Professor Thomas for her service.

"One of the biggest changes RUN has effected is in the expectations of government, which has developed a greater appreciation of the role of regional communities and their valuable contribution to the success of any university system.

"Those from regional areas which are often socially and economically disadvantaged should be given every opportunity to take up university study no matter their background or circumstance," she said.

"I extend my best wishes to the incoming Chair, Professor Hill, and thank all those involved with RUN for the extraordinary support they've provided in building and shaping the organisation we now have," she said.

Incoming Chair, Professor Greg Hill, said since its establishment in 2011, RUN had become

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an effective voice for tertiary education in regional Australia.

"I look forward to chairing RUN at a time when the government is poised to make major policy changes," he said.

"RUN has worked very well for regional universities, which provide tertiary education to those who might otherwise have to leave their home towns to access it.

"I'd like to extend my thanks to Professor Thomas and the other vice-chancellors who have previously served as RUN chair for the positive impact they have made.
